

What to do if a child or adult displays Coronavirus symptoms in school.

If an adult working with or near your child identifies your child is displaying coronavirus symptoms, we will follow procedures as directed by government guidance.

If you or someone in your house has coronavirus symptoms or has tested positive, you must self-isolate for 14 days.

The adult working with your child will stay with them and take them to our First Aid Isolation Room, ensuring that the child or adult does not come into close contact with anyone else as they move through school.

The adult supporting will put on PPE as soon as possible in order to protect themselves. Our PPE is stored just outside the isolation room.

Once in the isolation room, the member of staff will notify the office via telephone.

The office will notify the Head of School who will notify the Executive Head.

The member of staff supporting your child will take your child's temperature and monitor their symptoms for a short while.

If the symptoms persist, school will make contact with home and ask that you collect your child immediately. You will be directed to your nearest testing centre and asked to update school as soon as you have your test results.

Once your child has been collected, a cleaner will clean the First Aid Isolation Room, and any PPE will be disposed of in a bin bag, which will be tied closed and put in the appropriate bin.

Where there is a positive case, the school will contact West Yorkshire Health Protection Team. They will issue the school with next steps, which may including closing a class or bubble. The school will then take action to contact the parents of children who may be affected.
