Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very proud of the effort being made by our Year 6 pupils as they prepare for their end of key stage assessments and we would like to thank you for the support that you are giving your child with his/her revision at home.

SATs week begins on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May; we have included a timetable below. To enable the children to come into school and feel relaxed, we will be running a breakfast club on Monday – Thursday mornings of that week from 8.15a.m. The children will be able to come into school and enjoy a slice of toast or a bowl of cereal and juice. There will be no cost for this to parents. We strongly encourage you to allow your child to join their friends and feel as relaxed and prepared as possible by attending this breakfast club.

The papers will be taken each morning during the first lesson so it is important for the children to arrive in school punctually and are at school each day of SATs week. It is also very important that the children are well rested in the run up to SATs week and during the tests so that they can concentrate properly and stay focused. They would benefit from earlier nights and reduced screen time (such as games consoles, TV/DVDs/laptop or tablet time).

Please ensure that your child brings a **plain** water bottle (no words or logo) and does not wear a smart/interactive watch.

Wednesday 15 <sup>th</sup> May	Maths Paper 1 (Arithmetic) – 30 minutes Maths Paper 2 (Reasoning) – 40 minutes
Thursday 16 <sup>th</sup> May	Maths Paper 3 (Reasoning) – 40 minutes

Attending this breakfast club forms a vital part of our preparation for the day, and to ensure that your child feels as relaxed and prepared as possible for each day. For your child to achieve their best, it is a club that they need to attend.

We will ask the kitchen to prepare for your child to attend, but please inform us if your child cannot.
